Stuart Deal (Center) of JW Burress in Charlotte was given the challenge to provide a hammer large enough to break the hard granite in central North Carolina. Stewart was confident the ***Magnum RHB 330 S*** would break the rock. The question was could it be mounted on the Hitachi EX 270 that was required for mobility?

The answer was yes! This is in part due the ***Magnum RHB330 S*** being equipped with shock absorbers that prevent the energy from escaping back into the excavator. Without shock absorbers a much larger excavator would be required. Weight wasn't an issue due to ***Magnum's*** light design. What's left? Brute Power! ***The RHB330 S*** has a CIMA impact energy rating of 4475 ft. lbs.
